Established in 1988 by the Western Interstate Commission for Higher Education (WICHE), the <u>WICHE Cooperative for Educational Technologies (WCET)</u> is a nonprofit membership-based organization working to improve the quality and reach of digital learning programs. WCET maintains over 365 member organizations from colleges, universities, higher education organizations, and companies. WCET and member organizations collectively engage in efforts to progress the practice, policy, and advocacy of digital learning in higher education.

WCET's overall policy work focuses on:

- · regular and substantive interaction
 - compliance and financial aid regulations regarding faculty credentials and academic engagement standards in distance education courses
- state authorization (interstate compliance)
 - state and federal laws and regulations that apply to institutions who operate in another state
- · professional licensure notifications
 - state and federal regulations to inform learners if institutions and programs meet state educational requirements for a profession
- · educational benefits for military affiliated students
 - o financial assistance for students participating in postsecondary distance education
- student identity verification
 - assurance that the same learner enrolled in a distance education course is the same to completes course assessments

 - o page for smaller topics and policies no longer followed

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Content on Microcredentials in Learn & Work Ecosystem Library





Missing or Underdeveloped Areas in Library's Collection

Employer Adoption & Demand Signals

The Library has strong coverage of definitions and education-led initiatives, but fewer resources that directly document:

- ➤ How employers are adopting or evaluating microcredentials
- Industry-specific acceptance patterns beyond IT, education, and manufacturing
- Employer return-on-investment studies or talent pipeline data connected to microcredentials

This is an area where the field itself is thin, but users often want more

Microcredential Federal & State Policy Activity

Policy is emerging at federal and state levels but current Library content is lighter on:

- Department of Education rulemaking or guidance affecting short-term credentials
- Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) alignment with microcredentials
- Federal and state funding models tied to skills-based pathways, Pell expansion pilots, LER ecosystems
- State policies that guide institutional developments

System-level Credential Frameworks

Many countries have national qualification frameworks (QFs) that integrate microcredentials, but there is limited content on:

- How national or state-level frameworks classify microcredentials
- Quality benchmarks and level descriptors tied to frameworks
- Examples of how frameworks guide credential portability, transfer, stacking.

This gap matters because credential frameworks shape how microcredentials are recognized, validated and connected to pathways

An Overview of the Micro-credentialing Model at FGCU

Getting Started

- Establish "the why"
- Align with university, regional and state priorities
- Engage faculty, staff and students in conceptual conversations
- Define the terminology- Micro-credential and Digital Badge
- Identify intended audiences and methods
- Engage employers in content development, competency identification and assessment



Micro-credential

A narrowly focused area of study where learners demonstrate mastery of knowledge, skills, or abilities. Micro-credentials represent competencies that are defined by industry or community partners, granular in nature, and assessed in collaboration with University content area experts. Micro-credentials are offered outside of traditional degrees.




Micro-credential

represents mastery of a specific competency

(something you know or are able to do)





Digital Badge

a visual emblem that validates the competency, making it visible to employers and others






Digital Badge

A visual emblem that validates mastery of knowledge, skills, or abilities completed within a Micro-credential. A Digital Badge carries "meta" data, representing verification of mastery of competencies to an external audience. Digital Badges may be shared on social media and are portable

Three Types of Micro-Credentials for Three Purposes



Industry Readiness

Created in partnership with industries to develop in-demand skills and competencies

Build off and supplement for-credit courses and programs

Credit-bearing course + co-curricular activities



Core Skill Visibility

Develop and recognize foundational competencies for career-long adaptability

Skills recognized by NACE: Teamwork, Oral Communication, Leadership, Critical Thinking, etc.

Coursework + extra- and cocurricular activities



Upskilling & Reskilling

Non-credit micro-courses focused on specific workforce competencies

First Time Supervision, Workforce Readiness in Healthcare, Blockchain, etc.

Quick response to skills gaps for students, professionals, FGCU alumni, and all learners



Credit-aligned Micro-credentials at FGCU that provide students with electives toward a degree

- Research shows the importance of reflection on Transferable Skills


How Do We Ensure Quality Micro-credentials?

- 4. Quality Review Standards for Microcredentials






