- Focus on equity, cost savings, research, and open pedagogy.



OER Initiatives Work



- Faculty who are aware of one or more OER initiatives are three to four times more likely to be adopters of OER.
- This holds true for both faculty teaching introductory-level courses and the general population of faculty.
- When implemented at the institution level, OER initiatives result in a measurable rise in the number of faculty who are aware of OER.
- Faculty who are aware of OER are much more likely to adopt OER as required course materials; those who have yet to adopt OER are much more likely to do so in the future.
- The impact of awareness of OER initiatives on adoption is consistent:
 - Two-and four-year institutions.
 - The level of course being taught.
 - All regional compacts in the U.S.
