



New Accessibility Requirements for Web Content & Mobile Applications for Public Entities

Regulation Issued by the Civil Rights Division of the Department of Justice

New Accessibility Requirements: Overview

- Revises the regulation implementing Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).
- Establishes requirements, including the adoption of WCAG 2.1 Level AA standards, for making accessible the services, programs, and activities offered by state and local government entities to the public through the web and mobile applications.

New Accessibility Requirements: Overview (continued)

- Nearly all digital material hosted by a public university or college will need to be compliant, including web content that is password protected.
- Institutions are responsible for contractual, licensed, or thirdparty services meeting the accessibility requirement.
- Although this rule applies only to public institutions, additional regulations governing private colleges and universities may be coming soon.

What are the WCAG 2.1 standards?

Web accessibility is standardized by the Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG) 2.1, published by the World Wide Web Consortium (W3C). WCAG 2.1 is organized into four principles:

- Web content must be perceivable alt text for images, semantic heading structure, form labels and tool tips, etc.
- Web content must be operable keyboard accessible. Execution of tasks does not rely on the use of a mouse.
- Web content must be understandable clear, simple, and consistent design/layout, and digestible content.
- Web content must be robust compatibility with assistive technology (AT), such as screen readers and voice command. WCAG standards are written to be AT agnostic.

Strategies for Implementation

Washington State Board for Community and Technical Colleges

ADA Title II Work Group formed to facilitate system-wide coordinated response to the ruling.

- Policy interpretation and guidance
- Webinars, trainings, and tools
- SBCTC hosts Canvas accessibility training courses
- Collect baseline data (in-house surveys and Canvas Ally tool) to track system-wide progress
- Memos shared with Executive leadership for continued awareness and buy-in



All 34 colleges identified Accessible IT (AIT) Coordinator role. Helps to lead and organize efforts locally across the colleges.

SBCTC – Accessible IT Coordinator Role



Colleges encouraged to form Web Accessibility Work Groups.

Coordinator acts as liaison between their college and SBCTC.





Revitalize dormant email listserv to connect Coordinators together: AT Coords.



Coordinator responds to survey requests and provide requested data.

Distribution of AIT COORDINATOR ROLE by Department





SBCTC – Canvas Ally Tool Accessibility tool embedded in your Learning Management System designed to make digital course content more accessible and inclusive.

Identifies issues and helps guide fixes.

SBCTC attempting to track system level data to track trends and progress.

SBCTC – College Websites

- Work with college web administrators to:
 - Determine if content creators and web editors receive training.
 - identify usage of website accessibility diagnostic/reporting tools.
- Long-term hope to identify a tool appropriate for all colleges and support coordination of adoption.
- Start with survey to establish baseline.



Gaps

- Third-party mobile/web applications and Publisher materials.
- Many colleges do not have the technical skillset and tools to evaluate and validate a vendor's claims.
- Free products often sidestep the procurement process.
- We must apply **more collective pressure** and expectations on the vendors to prove their level of accessibility compliance.
 - Vendor demonstrations
 - Robust contract language
 - 1 Ed Tech Vendor Rubric....

Vendor Compliance

1EdTech Consortium

TrustEd Apps Accessibility Rubric

A self-evaluation tool about the accessibility of a product and its organization's commitment to accessibility.

- Self-evaluation with task force review to ensure accuracy and thoroughness
- Help member organizations manage their accessibility vetting process
- Encourage suppliers to develop organizational maturity
- Enable accessible edtech tools for all learners



What problem does the rubric solve?

The rubric helps institutions:

- Evaluate important non-technical aspects of accessibility that should impact a purchasing decision.
- Leverage the accessibility expertise of the 1Ed Tech member community, if the institution does not have accessibility experts on staff
- Provides standard information that many institutions ask for by consolidating it in one place.

The rubric helps suppliers to build trust.

Main Purpose of the Rubric



- Leverage accessibility expertise across 1EdTech member organizations.
- Provide a common framework for discussions and evaluating tools with tool providers and suppliers about accessibility.
- Supplement legislated requirements and / or accessibility conformance documentation.


Request for Proposal (RFP) Requirement

We require all respondents to this RFP to complete the 1EdTech TrustEd Apps Accessibility Rubric, following the 1EdTech TrustEd Apps Accessibility Rubric Specification 1.0. This rubric is an essential tool for evaluating the accessibility maturity of products, ensuring they cater to a wide range of student abilities. Respondents must provide detailed insights into their accessibility policies, design considerations, and training initiatives. This requirement aligns with our commitment to inclusivity and ensures that all educational tools procured meet and exceed standard accessibility conformance documentation.




